

A Message From Your New Club President

As your newly elected President for this year, I want to let you know what action was taken at our annual meeting on January 20th. As everyone knows, we have had trouble keeping our kitchen/restaurant open. After much discussion, all of which was in the form of positive suggestions, the membership voted to put in place a \$20.00 per month food allowance. Beginning March 1, 2004, you will be billed for \$20.00 each month in addition to your normal dues. You will receive coupons totaling \$20.00, which can be used to pay for your meals at the club. These coupons will be good until the end of the month after they are issued, so you will have two (2) months in which to use a particular month's coupons. You will be asked to sign the coupon when it is redeemed. You may also sell, or give away your coupons if you find you are not going to use them within the allotted two month period. This \$20.00 food allowance is designed to increase the volume of activity in our club's restaurant. You cannot lose any money if you use or sell your coupons within the two month time period. We feel this \$20.00 will enable us to maintain a higher level of service in our club's restaurant by encouraging more participation.

The other action taken at the annual meeting was the lowering of the entry fee to join our club from \$1,000.00 to \$250.00. It was felt that a \$1,000.00 entry fee might keep people from joining, while \$250.00 would not. With this in mind, please encourage non-members to join Rolling Hills Country Club at this new, reduced entry fee. Rolling Hills has much to offer and we need new members.

At the annual meeting, Stan Moleski and Keith Futrell were elected as new Board Members. Stan was elected as Vice-President and Melissa Davis was re-elected Secretary. Returning Board Members are Gary Pugh, John Johnson, Gary Kerns and John Jackson. We serve on the RHCC Board, without pay, because we recognize the importance of our club to its members and to our community. We each want our club to be as successful as possible, as I am sure you do too.
